Conference Highlights

Janis Weber, Ph.D.

Dr. Weber, an enrolled member of the Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina, has worked with disparate populations for more than 10 years, concentrating principally on public health work with native/ indigenous peoples. Her work involves formative research in the public health area and the integration of culturally competent contextual realities with sound, scientifically-based methodologies. Dr. Weber was a lead team member in efforts of the CDC-Office on Smoking and Health in both the American Indian Tobacco Survey and the Alaska Native Tobacco Survey.

Hans Rollema, Ph.D.

Dr. Rollema started working at Pfizer Pharmaceuticals in 1992, for the last 5 years as a Research Fellow. He has multiple publications as a result of his lab and collaborative projects. His most notable work has been with the drug, varenicline, the smoking cessation agent now marketed as Chantix. From the beginning he was part of the team that discovered and developed varenicline and acts now as the preclinical expert and helps to respond to queries from regulatory agencies. Currently his lab continues to support various CNS discovery projects, while he still spends a substantial amount of time on varenicline.
