What is SpeakOUT?

The SpeakOUT Youth Initiative provides opportunities for youth (14-18) to gain leadership training, practice advocacy skills, and receive recognition when they “speak out” against cancer. SpeakOUT participants learn how to influence real-world issues and save lives by making a difference through individual power and the spirit of working together.

What are SpeakOUT Workshops?

Workshops focus on assisting both youth leaders and their adult advisors in building strong youth coalitions. These coalitions work to prevent cancer through tobacco education, nutrition, physical activity, and school health advocacy. These free, hands-on workshops are hosted in local communities.
