## **RESOLUTION #18-03-03**

## Public Health Improvement and Training CDC-RFA-OT18-1803 - Tribal Public Health Capacity Building and Quality Improvement Umbrella Cooperative Agreement

WHEREAS, the Northwest Portland Area Indian Health Board (NPAIHB) is a tribal organization under P.L. 93-638 that represents forty-three Federally-recognized Indian Tribes in Idaho, Oregon, and Washington on health related issues; and

WHEREAS, the NPAIHB is dedicated to assisting and promoting the health needs and concerns of Indian people; and

WHEREAS, the primary goal of the NPAIHB is to improve the health and quality of life of its member Tribes; and

**WHEREAS**, in furtherance of this goal in 1997, NPAIHB established the Northwest Tribal Epidemiology Center (*EpiCenter*) in an effort to improve the quality of American Indian and Alaska Native (AI/AN) epidemiology data; and

**WHEREAS,** The *EpiCenter* has gained national recognition for developing and implementing many useful and innovative projects to improve the health and quality of life of Northwest tribes and has served as a national model for other Indian Health Service (IHS) areas to emulate in establishing their EpiCenter programs; and

**WHEREAS**, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has invited proposals to strengthen and improve optimize the quality and performance of the tribal public health system, including infrastructure, workforce, data and information systems, programs and services, resources and communication, and partnerships; and

**WHEREAS**, this cooperative agreement will assist in providing funding for public health transformation at the community level; and

**WHEREAS**, this proposal will provide a framework to optimize the quality and performance of the tribal public health system, including infrastructure, workforce, data and information systems, programs and services, resources and communication, and/or partnerships; and

WHEREAS, Northwest Tribes have expressed explicit interest in tribal public health program capacity building and quality improvement strategies and activities, including those to support increased used of nationally established standards, such as those for public health accreditation, and;

**WHEREAS**, Northwest Tribes are committed to implementing culturally fitting, practicebased evidence to address the most pressing public health needs; and

WHEREAS, the goals of this initiative are consistent with the goals and objectives of the NPAIHB; and

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the NPAIHB endorses and supports an effort by staff of the NPAIHB, under the guidance of the Executive Director, to submit a proposal to the CDC for funding opportunity CDC-RFA-OT18-1803 "Tribal Public Health Capacity Building and Quality Improvement Umbrella Cooperative Agreement."
