Lucille Woodville Award

The United States Public Health Service (USPHS), Nurse Professional Advisory Committee (N-PAC) to the Office of the Surgeon General (OSG) is pleased to announce a call for nominations for the **2010 Lucille Woodville Award**

This award was established in the Public Health Service's (PHS) centennial year as a memorial to the professional career of Lucille Woodville, who began her illustrious career in the Indian Health Service (IHS) in 1956. As part of her work in IHS, Ms. Woodville established the first Nurse Midwifery Service in Bethel, Alaska. She retired in 1973, after serving as Assistant Chief (1964-1971) and Chief (1971-1973) of the Maternal Child Health Branch, Division of Indian Health, Health Resources Services Administration, of the PHS.

Eligibility

This award is open to Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) registered nurses (Civil Service, Commissioned Corps, or Tribal Direct Hire).

This award honors a nurse midwife or a maternal/child health nurse whose work has resulted in:

- o significant contribution to the health and well-being of mothers and newborns;
- o Each nominee must demonstrate outstanding contributions in improving maternal/child health;
- o This contribution may be the commitment of their time and skills in the clinical setting, or may be in the design, implementation and/or management of innovative maternal/child health programs.

Nomination Procedure

Any employer or employee of the PHS or Associate of a PHS contract or grant program may nominate a PHS nurse for which this award has been established in the form of a letter containing:

- o name, title and grade or rank of the nominee;
- o work experience and educational background of the nominee;
- o a brief description of the nominee's present duties and responsibilities including the scope of work;
- o a narrative statement of how the person meets the criteria for the award including a description of the specific accomplishments and/or contributions on which the nomination is based;
- o must state, in writing, that the individual is in good standing and has an active RN license on file (for Commissioned Corps officers it must be on file with OCCO);
- o an endorsement by the nominee's supervisor (responsible for ensuring the candidate's good standing and work performance);

For Commissioned Corps officers, the final OCCO verification will be completed by the NPAC Awards Subcommittee Co-chairs to ensure that there are no outstanding adverse actions and that an active nursing license is on file;

All Commissioned Officers must be classified as **OFRD Basic Ready**; and

Award nominations should be limited to two pages.

Mabel May Wagner Award

The United States Public Service Health (USPHS), Nurse Professional Advisory Committee (NPAC) to the Office of the Surgeon General (OSG) is pleased to announce a call for nominations for the **2010 Mabel May Wagner Award**. This award, established in 1979, is open to all professional nurses in the USPHS who are engaged in clinical nursing practice.

The Mabel May Wagner Award will include an engraved plaque and a \$1000.00 cash award and will REQUIRE the awardee to complete the attached Ethics Review Form to be endorsed by their respective agency's Ethics Officer.

Eligibility

This award is open to Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) registered nurses (Civil Service, Commissioned Corps, or Tribal Direct Hire).

The nominee should demonstrate one of the following criteria:

- o Exemplifies resourcefulness and dedication in helping to accomplish the mission of the Public Health Services;
- o Demonstrates professional and technical skills and competence raising the quality of nursing;
- o Displays evidence of exceptional ability to apply nursing standards of practice;
- o Remains involved in continuing education as a participant, organizer or sponsor of it; and
- o Is of such excellence as to merit Public Health Service recognition.

Nomination Procedure

Anyone may nominate an eligible nurse for service that meets the purpose for which this award

has been established.

Nominations may be made by an HHS employee or employee where the nurse officer, tribal nurse or civil service nurse is detailed, in the form of a letter containing:

- o name, title and grade or rank of the nominee;
- o work experience and educational background of the nominee;
- o a brief description of the nominee's present duties and responsibilities including the scope of work;
- o a narrative statement of how the person meets the criteria for the award including a description of the specific accomplishments and/or contributions on which the nomination is based as well as exploring current practice vs. lifetime achievement. The achievements for which the nurse is being recognized should be within the last three years.
- o a statement that the individual has an RN license in good standing and has an active license on file (for Commissioned Corps officers it must be on file with OCCO);
- o an endorsement by the nominee's supervisor (responsible for ensuring the candidate's good standing and work performance);

For Commissioned Corps officers, the final OCCO verification will be completed by the NPAC Awards Subcommittee Co-chairs to ensure that there are no outstanding adverse actions and that an active nursing license is on file.

All Commissioned Officers must be classified as **OFRD Basic Ready**.

Award nominations should be limited to two pages.
