Through the Indian Health Service's *Methamphetamine & Suicide Prevention Initiative (MSPI)*, the Northwest Portland Area Indian Health Board (NPAIHB) can provide implementation grants (of up to \$10,000 unless otherwise discussed with NPAIHB staff) to support Tribal Suicide Prevention programs and activities in the Pacific Northwest. Programs and activities must follow the MSPI funding requirements noted below.
