Administration for Children and Families Announces  
Tribal Resources Day and Consultation Session, September 28-29

The Administration for Children and Families (ACF), in the attached August 24, 2010, letter to tribal leaders, announced that it will hold a Tribal Resources Day and Tribal Consultation session on September 28-29, 2010, in Washington, D.C.

September 28: Tribal Resources. ACF will host a Tribal Resources Day to provide information regarding its programs and funding opportunities and on creating comprehensive community programs. Tribal planning officers are particularly encouraged to attend; ACF will provide a stipend of up to \$400 for the first 50 participants who register (limit two per tribe).

September 29: Consultation. ACF, which has been utilizing the Department of Health and Human Resources tribal consultation policy, has put together a federal/tribal workgroup which has drafted a tribal consultation policy specific to ACF and its programs. That draft will be sent to tribal leaders prior to the September meetings. Written comments on consultation and program issues should be sent to ACF by September 21, 2010. Comments need not be limited to consultation matters.

There are many ACF programs which provide direct funding to tribes including:

- Child Support Enforcement
- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families
- Child Care and Development Block Grant
- Head Start
- Administration for Native Americans
- Foster Care and Adoption Assistance
- Home Visitation Program
- Child Abuse and Neglect

Of note is that the next Congress is expected to take up reauthorization of the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program and that legislation is likely to include a number of the other programs listed above. Please let us know if we may provide additional information or assistance regarding the upcoming Administration for Children and Families meetings.

The Administration for Children and Families (ACF), Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) is pleased to announce the 2010 ACF Tribal Resources Day and Tribal Consultation Session scheduled for September 28 - 29, 2010, at The Fairfax at Embassy Row, 2100 Massachusetts Avenue, NW, Washington, DC 20008.

Since 2005, ACF has been working under the guidance of the HHS Tribal Consultation Policy. Due to the various programs administered by ACF and the many requests from Tribes for consultation for specific programs, as well as specific program mandates for tribal consultation, ACF is developing a Tribal Consultation Policy to help ACF program and regional offices better engage Federally Recognized Indian Tribes in the development or revision of policies, regulations, and proposed legislation that impact American Indians. ACF firmly believes that to create a good policy, ACF needs input from the Tribes to ensure that we are meeting Tribal needs and establishing a partnership that can carry into the future.

ACF assembled a Tribal/Federal Workgroup to develop a draft policy that ACF will send to Tribal Leaders prior to the ACF Tribal Consultation Session. During the Consultation session on September 29, 2010, ACF is interested in receiving Tribal feedback on the policy and in working together to further refine a policy that meets both of our needs and works towards solidifying our partnership. Please feel free to provide your comments in written format in the event we are unable to fully address them during the meeting.

ACF Principals will also be available to speak with Tribal Leaders to discuss issues important to the Tribes. To better prepare ACF Principals, we are asking that you submit written testimony addressing your most important issues regarding ACF programs no later than September 21, 2010. This request for testimonies does not prohibit you from discussing issues at the consultation meeting itself. Testimonies and consultation policy comments can be submitted to:


