### Performance Management & Quality Improvement Training Series PHAB Accreditation Related Workshop, Webinars and Round Table

The training series will focus on developing performance management systems and quality improvement plans and policies. It is designed to answer the following questions:

- What does an optimal public health department performance management system look like?
- How should your department begin to establish a performance management framework?
- What are the incremental steps to implementing a performance management system?
- How is a performance management system strategically fed into a quality improvement plan?
- What is the relationship between the community health improvement plan, organizational strategic plan, and performance management system?
- What is included in writing and implementing an effective quality improvement plan?
