Oregon Health Authority (OHA) - FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES POSTED FOR COMMUNITY PARTNERS

Description:

Oregon Health Authority (OHA) posted two Requests for Grant Proposals (RFGPs) seeking community partner organizations to help reach out to and enroll Oregonians into health insurance.

In addition, OHA posted a Request for Applications (RFA) seeking volunteer organizations to provide enrollment assistance to Oregonians applying for health insurance through Cover Oregon.

Cover Oregon and OHA are working together to administer the community partner program focused on helping Oregonians get the health insurance they need. More information is available below for each opportunity.

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES:

Two RFGPs are now posted on the state's procurement website, the Oregon Procurement Information Network (ORPIN). http://orpin.oregon.gov/open.dll/welcome

Grantee organizations will be chosen through a formal RFGP process. OHA will evaluate proposals and award funds based on a proposed work plan and budget. Both grants will remain open until August 28, 2013. OHA anticipates that final agreements will be signed by October 1, 2013.

> Public Education & Outreach Grant:

The Public Education and Outreach Grant Program (grant 3640) is available to community-based organizations, local governments, and coalitions, and is designed to provide targeted outreach and public education to Oregonians who are potentially eligible to access health insurance through Cover Oregon, including people living in geographically isolated areas or with additional barriers. This grant does not fund enrollment assistance. Grant funding is for six months in conjunction with Cover Oregon open enrollment, running from October 2013 through March 2014.

> Provider Outreach & Enrollment Grant:

The Provider Outreach and Enrollment Grant Program (grant 3639) is available to providers such as health departments, migrant clinics, medical providers, mental health providers, hospitals, rural health clinics and more. The grant is designed to provide direct enrollment assistance and related outreach to those who are potentially eligible to access health insurance through Cover Oregon. Grant funding is for 12 months.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY:

Community partners interested in helping individuals and families apply for health insurance through Cover Oregon's online marketplace can submit an application in response to the RFA and contract with OHA on a volunteer basis. The RFA is now posted on ORPIN, and will also be available on www.coveroregon.com. The RFA is open through November 2014 and may be extended.

REQUIRED TRAINING:

In order to provide Cover Oregon enrollment assistance, all individuals within a grantee or volunteer organization must complete an online training course followed by an in-person training session.

Description: The Aetna Foundation is dedicated to the promotion of wellness, health, and access to high-quality health care for everyone, while supporting the communities it serves.

The foundation's Regional Grants program funds community-wellness initiatives that serve those most at risk for poor health - including low-income, underserved, and minority populations -- in Aetna's priority cities and states.

In 2013, grants will target communities where healthy food can be difficult to buy, and where social and environmental factors may limit people's ability to be physically active. The foundation is particularly interested in programs that provide nutrition education and help increase the availability of affordable fresh fruits and vegetables in underserved communities and/or programs that provide opportunities for physical activity in underserved communities.

Sexually Transmitted Infections Cooperative Research Centers (STI CRC) (U19)

Award Amount: \$11,000,000

Description: The purpose of this FOA is to solicit applications for the Sexually Transmitted Infections Cooperative Research Centers (STI CRC) program. The STI CRC program facilitates multidisciplinary, synergistic collaborations that will increase our understanding and further our knowledge of co-infections of two or more specific STIs, as well as the interactions between and among different STI pathogens that may cause or enhance polymicrobial infections of the urogenital tract, e.g., bacterial vaginosis (BV), pelvic inflammatory disease (PID), intraamniotic infection (IAI) and non-gonococcal urethritis (NGU). This collaborative effort is expected to catalyze the discovery of new approaches to prevent, diagnose, and treat co-infections, polymicrobial infections and other clinical outcomes that affect reproductive health.

Deadline: <u>KaBOOM!</u> is inviting grant applications from communities anywhere in the United States working to establish joint use agreements to re-open playground and recreational facilities previously unavailable due to safety and upkeep concerns. (No specific deadline.)

Amount: Let's Play Land Use grants of \$15,000 and \$30,000 will support creation of joint-use agreements between local governments and school districts that address cost concerns related to safety, vandalism, maintenance, and liability issues to re-open previously unavailable playgrounds and recreational facilities. The \$15,000 grants will support the opening of at least four playgrounds in cities with populations of less than 100,000 people. The \$30,000 grants will support the opening of at least four playgrounds in cities with populations of less than 100,000 people. The \$30,000 grants will support the opening of at least four playgrounds in cities with populations of less than 100,000 people. The \$30,000 grants will support the opening of at least eight playgrounds in larger communities.

Description: Grants can be used for training and technical assistance, utilities and other building related to the extra use of the facility, legal fees, contract security services, and marketing campaigns related to the joint-use agreement. Grant recipients must commit to opening the playgrounds within twelve months of the grant decision.

They will only request this information later if needed as part of the proposal development.
