Dental Team Awareness: Signs and Symptoms of Abuse in Children and Adolescents

## DESCRIPTION

In recognition of Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month and National Children's Dental Health Month, the Health Resources and Services Administration's (HRSA) Office of Women's Health in collaboration with HRSA's Bureau of Primary Health Care and the National Maternal and Child Oral Health Resource Center will host a webinar to raise awareness of differences in unintentional dental trauma and dental trauma as a result of abuse in children and adolescents. The session will also identify the signs and symptoms of abuse that dental providers can detect during exams and routine dental appointments, and steps providers can take to report the abuse or intervene on behalf of the patient.

Today over 1 million children will become victims of child abuse or neglect and 65% of physical abuse cases involve head, neck, or facial injuries. Dentists are used to seeing injuries of the head, neck, and face and should learn how to identify differences in unintentional trauma and those injuries consistent with abuse, which in many cases can look the same and exhibit similar signs.

# LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Participants will learn:

- The various signs of child abuse including physical, behavioral, emotional, and sexual
- · The dentists' role in detection, documentation, and notification of authorities
- Why it's important to know the differences in unintentional dental trauma and those injuries as a result of abuse
- · Why action is often avoided
- The procedures used by dentists to detect a positive case of abuse
- The use of slides and pictures to help identify contusions, burns, lacerations of the tongue and lips, fractured or displaced teeth, fractured facial bone and jaw, if gags were applied to the mouth and neck, and how to determine the age of bruises.
