Healthy Smiles, Healthy Children Invites Letters of Intent for 2014 Access to Care Grants

Deadline: August 1st, 2013

Description: The Foundation of the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry launched the Healthy Smiles, Healthy Children initiative in 1987 with the aim of providing quality oral health care to children in need. To that end, HSHC has announced a call for Letters of Intent from pediatric dental care organizations for its 2014 Access to Care Grants program.

Through the call, HSHC will award single-year matching grants of up to \$20,000 to support community-based initiatives that provide oral health care to underserved children. Priority will be given to successful programs with the potential for replication in other communities, as well as initiatives that have worked in collaboration with other institutions and organizations.

Funds may be applied to cover the cost of clinic supplies and instruments, patient/parent education materials, take-home supplies (toothbrushes, toothpaste, etc.), education and/or outreach to recruit dentist participation in program activities, and/or other activities with clear, direct impact on pediatric oral health care.

To be eligible, applicants must be a U.S.-based nonprofit organization or local government agency that provides dental services to children in the U.S. or a U.S.

William T. Grant Foundation Invites Applications for Youth Social Setting Research Projects

Deadline: The next deadline for submission of letters of inquiry is August 1, 2013, at 3:00 p.m. EST.

Award Amount: Research grants typically range between \$100,000 and \$600,000 and cover two to three years of support. Projects involving secondary data analysis are at the lower end of the budget range, whereas projects involving new data collection and sample recruitment can be at the higher end. Proposals to launch experiments in which settings (e.g., classrooms, schools, and youth programs) are randomly assigned to conditions sometimes have higher awards.

For smaller projects, we have a separate funding mechanism, Officers' Research grants. These awards cover budgets up to \$25,000. Some are standalone projects that fit our Current Research Interests; others build off of larger projects. Junior scholars of color are encouraged to apply for these grants as a way to build their research programs.
