# Secretary's Corner

#### May 9, 2013

Secretary Kathleen Sebelius announced new funding to help more uninsured Americans enroll in new health insurance coverage options made available by the Affordable Care Act. Approximately \$150 million will help community health centers provide in-person enrollment assistance to uninsured individuals across the nation. About 1,200 health centers operate nearly 9,000 service delivery sites nationwide and serve approximately 21 million patients each year. View the full release <u>here</u>.

#### May 8, 2013

Secretary Kathleen Sebelius announced a three-part initiative that for the first time gives consumers information on what hospitals charge. This is part of the Obama administration's work to make our health care system more affordable and accountable. New data released today show significant variation across the country and within communities in what hospitals charge for common inpatient services. Also today, HHS made approximately \$87 million available to states to enhance their rate review programs and further health care pricing transparency. In an example of how these data might be used, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) is planning a data visualization challenge which will further the dissemination of these data to larger audiences. #### May 7, 2013

Secretary Kathleen Sebelius released a statement on National Asthma Awareness Month. "It has been over 30 years since asthma emerged as a growing public health threat. During this time, we have made important progress through clinical, environmental and community health interventions. May is National Asthma Awareness Month, a time for us to renew our dedication to improving health outcomes for the 26 million Americans living with asthma, including 7.1 million children. It is also a time to call attention to where we can and must do more." View the full statement here.

#### May 6, 2013

Secretary Kathleen Sebelius released a statement on National Foster Care Month. "May is National Foster Care Month, a time to recommit ourselves to ensuring a better future for the more than 400,000 children in foster care throughout our nation. Secretary Kathleen Sebelius released a statement on National Nurses Week. "National Nurses Week gives us a chance to recognize the contribution of the health care providers at the heart of our health care system.
