2014 Celebrating Salish: Workshop Descriptions

Youth Story Telling / Theater Workshop

Youth StoryTelling/Theater Workshop

Participating high school-aged youth groups bring a story in their language or with key words in their language, along with props and costumes. The presenter will work with participants on developing their acting skills and working their story into a stage-able performance piece. Each group will have 10-15 minutes to present their story at the closing session of the conference. Limited to a maximum of 6-8 youth groups from the local Salish Tribes. (Colville, Kalispel, Spokane, Coeur d'Alene, Flathead, Okanagan).

Workshops for Session A, 10:15 - 11:45 pm, Wednesday, March 5

A1 Language Learning Software for Native Languages.

Participants will be shown a demonstration of the SalishTutor, StoryTeller, StoryTeacher, SalishReader, GrammarTutor, and Interactive Salish Workshop computer programs that are used in the teaching of the Kalispel and Colville-Okanagan languages. Participants will also be shown how to acquire the SalishTutor and StoryTeller software and adapt it to their language. These programs have already been created and are in use by people from the Colville, Kalispel, Flathead, Kootenai, and Spokane Tribes. The presentation will show how you can start using the program and how to add text, pictures, sounds, and phrases for your own language.

Presenters: James Parkin, Idiom Software and JR Bluff, Kalispel Language Program.

A2 Using TPR in an Immersion Pre-School.

Julie will be sharing the daily schedule, lesson plans, and TPR curriculum that she uses in her immersion preschool class at the Salish School of Spokane. In addition to a variety of classroom activities, Julie moves her 9 two, three, and four year old students through the Nsəlxcin (Colville-Okanagan) TPR book. They practice and learn the lessons, and are evaluated to track their achievement. The nsəlxcin TPR book is a free download from: www.interiorsalish.com

Presenter: Julie Simpson, Lead Preschool Teacher, Salish School of Spokane.

A3 Indigenizing your Language and Culture Curriculum.

This workshop will show how to develop a language and culture curriculum which that includes Tribal Elders and other tribal/community members. Determining what each person has to offer, and how to include fluent and non-fluent Elders in developing a curriculum that is all inclusive and tribal specific.

Presenter: Marsha Wynecoop, Spokane Tribal Language Program Director.











A4 Save the Language and the Language Will Save You.

The presenter will share her story and experience on her personal journey to learn her language. She will talk about how her language is transforming her life and healing her soul and how she believes that the language can heal all of Our People.

Presenter: Wendy Phillips, Director, Inchelium Childcare.

A5 Little Fawn Nursery Immersion Classroom Activities.

This workshop will focus on teaching strategies and classroom activities that introduce and reinforce vocabulary aimed at three, four and five year old language learners. The Little Fawn Nursery (LFN) staff members teach the Secwépemc Language by pairing early childhood education learning models and LFN child-centered curriculum based on a wide variety of themes and topics. Each unit of study consists of learning outcomes, instructional approaches, resources, and assessment.

A6 Kalispel-Pend Oreille Salish Fluent Elder Immersion Session. (Stan Bluff, Francis Cullooyah, Johnny Arlee, and Others)

B1 Electronic Salish Books and Printing Stories.

Joshua Brown will share Salish e-books he created and the software tools and process for creating them. These Salish language books can be enjoyed on several platforms ranging from desktop computers to hand held devices and phones; which all contain pictures, text and sound. Joshua will also discuss printing books and offers some low cost solutions using freeware specifically for quickly and easily printing books in endangered languages.

Presenter: Joshua Brown, Language Consultant

B2 Living Language.

Presenter will provide and in depth overview of his experience learning and teaching at Nkwusm Salish Language Immersion School, Ronan High School, and the Young Leaders Expeditionary Program. Workshop will include daily scheduling, teaching in Immersion, and Curriculum Development. Presenter will also discuss what he is doing at home with his family and community to promote and enhance language revitalization and overall health within the Flathead Indian Reservation Community.

B3 Assessing Indigenous Language Proficiency – Progress Over the Years. This presentation will detail the progress made over the past 10 years in the development of methods to assess Indigenous language proficiency. The journey will provide information from previous research up to and including the current status of language assessment in an immersion setting in the Salish language. Handouts will be provided. Presenters: Jack Miller, Professor, Thompson Rivers University.

B4 From Student to Teacher.

A "rags to riches" story of a young woman's journey to learn the Salish Language. Hear her story as she talks about her accomplishments and how she overcame obstacles and, along the way, how she found her own Identity.

With each lesson being recorded, the Tulalip Lushootseed Department hopes to one day provide a full online interactive college level course in order to reach language learners who cannot attend live classes.

Including the work she has completed at the University of Arizona, Linguistics Graduate School. She will share Linguistic basics including terms in Phonology, Morphology, and Syntax and a preliminary comparison of Quinault with other Salish Languages.

D4 Salish Literacy: Reading and Writing in an Immersion 1st and 2nd Grade Classroom.

Salish School of Spokane teaches literacy and math using nsəlxcin (Colville Salish) in our combined 1st/2nd grade classroom. We will be sharing examples of the nsəlxcin curriculum materials that we have developed for literacy and math, as well as the instructional techniques used to teach lessons in an immersion classroom. Attendees will see examples of Salish literacy materials including: reading books, phonics cards, alphabet & alphabet song, and mathbook. We will share and demonstrate Salish literacy and reading lessons, as well as Salish math lessons. We will show how we are having success in our immersion 1st & 2nd grade classroom, where students are both learning Salish and gaining strong academic skills.
