The Northwest Portland Area Indian Health Board and the Oregon Sexual Assault Task Force are hosting a Sexual Assault Response & Resource Circle (SARRC) training for Tribes in Western and Central Washington. This training is part of the Northwest Collaboration Against Sexual Assault in Tribal Communities Project. Designed for teams that address sexual assault in Tribal communities, we will discuss development of a multi-disciplinary team to improve quality of care for victims and work toward violence free Tribal communities.

We are looking for Tribal teams of 4-6 people (please see list of possible participants below) from Tribes in Central and Western Washington.

Possible participants include: Current sexual assault response team members, sexual assault advocates, Tribal police officers/ detectives, medical responders (nurses, physicians), Tribal court representatives (prosecutors, judges), violence prevention educators, mental health professionals, elders, offender management professionals, Indian Child Welfare, and others involved with fighting sexual assault from the Lower Elwha Klallam Tribe and other Tribes in Western and Central Washington.

Training Description: We will address steps in developing SARRCs, sexual assault dynamics, and group activities within your team.

Training Location: The training will be held at the Lower Elwha Klallam Tribe's Heritage Center on the Lower Elwha Klallam Tribe's Reservation.

Cost - The registration is free of charge and all expenses are paid (lodging, travel, per diem).
