First Nations' Native Agriculture & Food Systems College Scholarships are open to Native students throughout the United States!

First Nations Development Institute ([First Nations](#)) is now accepting applications for its Native Agriculture and Food Systems Scholarship Program that aims to encourage more Native American college students to enter these fields so that they can better assist their communities in advancing Native food sovereignty and improving overall health. These scholarships are for Native students throughout the United States. First Nations will award 20 to 25 scholarships of \$1,000 to \$1,500 each for the 2020-2021 academic school year to Native college students majoring in agriculture and agriculture-related fields, including agribusiness management, agri-science technologies, agronomy, animal husbandry, aquaponics, environmental studies, fisheries and wildlife, food production and safety, food-related policy and legislation, food science and technology, horticulture, irrigation science, and sustainable agriculture or food systems. Pivoting to Online Programming

If your program or organization is working to transition from in-person programming to interactive, online learning and engagement, this webinar will give you ideas and insight to help you move forward. Panelists Karl Duncan, Executive Director of the Poeh Cultural Center, Pueblo of Pojoaque in New Mexico, and Marcus Monenerkit, Director of Community Engagement at the Heard Museum in Phoenix, have developed multi-level approaches to engaging their community of artists, consumers, and students online.
