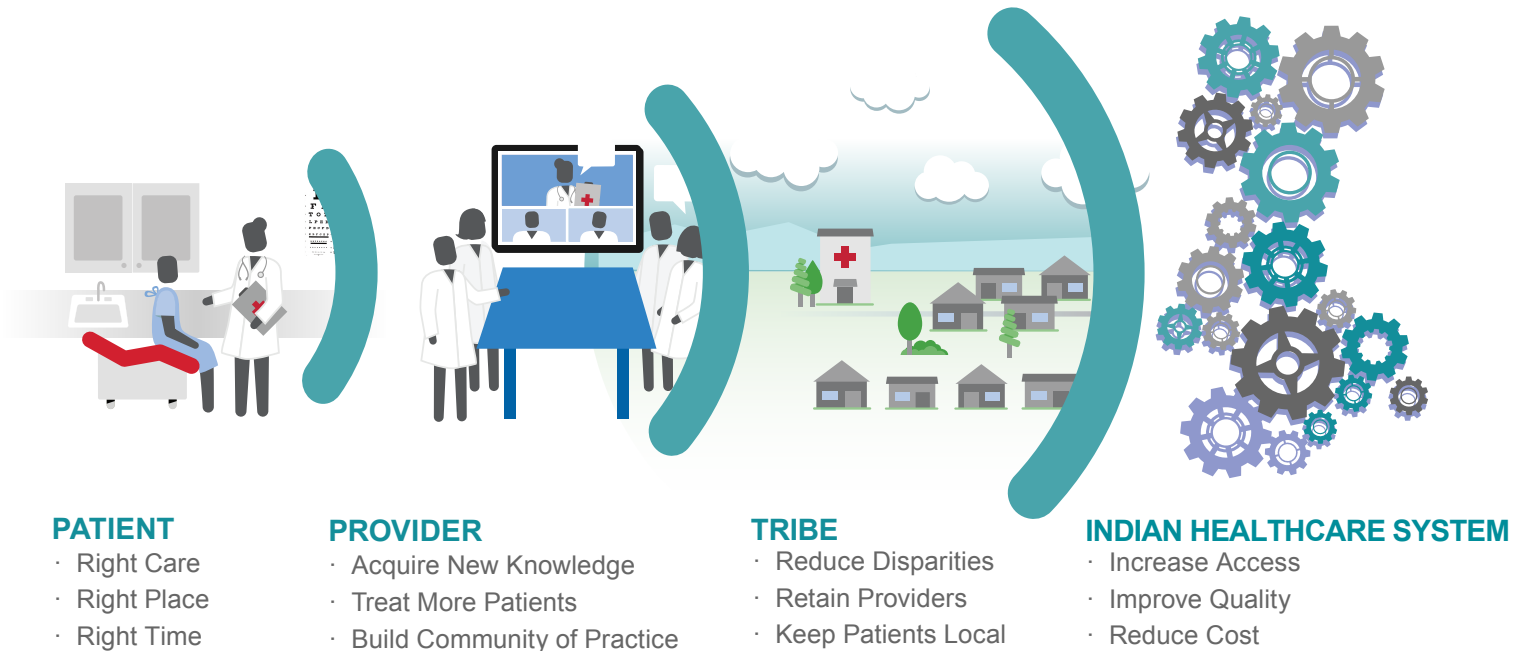


Indian Country ECHO - Hepatitis C and Substance Use Disorders

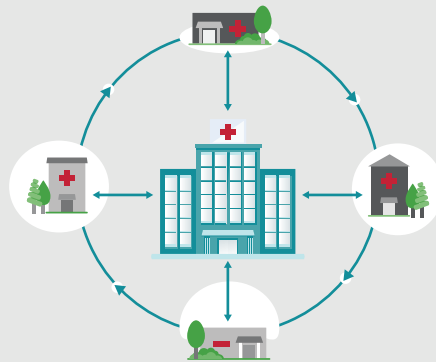
