




Evaluation Report: Overdose Safety Planning



On December 4th, 2018, data was collected during an overdose training with Missoula Partnership Health Center. The participants were given a pre-training and a post training survey. Based on the pre-training survey, 100% of the participants believe it is important to screen for risk of overdose in the primary care setting. 95% believes talking about overdose prevention with patients can decrease their risk. Yet, 52% participants said they do not routinely talk about overdose prevention with at risk-patients. 33% were not confident in their abilities to discuss risks of over dose with their patients. However, 42% does believe patients wants to talk about overdose prevention with their providers. And, 62% believes patients are not aware of overdose prevention strategies.

The participants were asked if they routinely assist patients in obtaining Naloxone. 62% said they do not. At the same time, 62% participants also said they do believe patients at risk of accidental overdose should be offered to have Naloxone. 33% do not feel confident in their ability to describe use and benefits of Naloxone to patients and 28% feels neutral about it.



After the training, 100% of the attendees said the training was an effective way to learn about Overdose Safety Planning. Most popular requests for future trainings were:

- 1) Training on how to administer Naloxone
- 2) Breakout group/role play
- 3) Provide handouts of slide to take notes during presentation and more handouts
- 4) Make the training longer and slower

100% of the attendees liked the flow of the OD Safety Plan. Also, everyone agreed that patients would respond well to completing it with the provider. 92% of whom said they would use the OD Safety Plan with new patients.

Some Comments left by the attendees

“I have specific patients /programs in mind OD Safety Plan would work great with.”

“It would take a while to get whole clinic on board.” Replying to OD Safety Plan seems like a quick and easy intervention.

“Only reason patients wouldn’t respond well to completing the OD Safety plan is because they have already been in the clinic for so long.”

“I love the concept of OD Safety Plan.”

“I like the direct approach.”

“The OD Safety Plan is self-explanatory and helpful, easy to follow.”
