

- POV/ICD-9: V07.31
- ICD-10: Z29.3
- Any PRC visit with the above codes

- If using Dentrix/RPMS, and not entering ICD-10 codes, the ZZZ.999 codes must be completed in RPMS, or they will not pass to PCC and get exported.
