


Treatment alone does not stop ECC IHS has estimated that it costs thousands of dollars to treat each child with ECC and \$8,000 or more if they are treated under general anesthesia. 40-50% of children treated with severe ECC have new decay within 4-12 months.

Assumptions


- •ECC is both preventable and manageable if we can see children regularly beginning soon after the first tooth erupts.
- •IHS/Tribal dental clinics are the best dental home for young children and dental treatment under general anesthesia should be avoided if possible.

New FDA Safety Warning

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is warning that repeated or lengthy use of general anesthetic and sedation drugs during surgeries or procedures in children younger than 3 years or in pregnant women during their third trimester may affect the development of children's brains.
