NPAIHB COVID-19 Weekly Data Update

35 Portland Area I/T/Us have reported to date

- ▶ Includes 30 tribes and tribally-based IHS Service Units (covering 70% of 43 tribes)

NPAIHB/IHS Portland Area Testing Data* as of May 10:

- ▶ Total Tested: 2,262
- ▶ Positive: 220**
- ▶ Negative: 2,005

I/T/U PPE Status as of May 11

- ▶ Adequate (3+ months): 6
- ▶ Limited (1-3 months): 9
- ▶ Inadequate (<1 month): 3
- ▶ Critical (<1 week): 1

I/T/U Test Kit Status as of May 11

- ▶ Adequate (3+ months): 1
- ▶ Limited (1-3 months): 10
- ▶ Inadequate (<1 month): 7
- ▶ Critical (<1 week): 1
- ▶ No test kits available: 1

*Data reported at ihs.gov/coronavirus include Abbott ID NOW analyzer results, as well as some results for tribal members not tested at I/T/U clinics

**NPAIHB can only verify 210 positives as of 5/11

COVID-19 Cases Reported by Tribes for Each State

- ▶ ID: 21
- ▶ OR: 30
- ▶ WA: 159

- ▶ These numbers include individuals not tested at an I/T/U facility but known to be positive for COVID-19

AI/AN COVID-19 Deaths Reported to NPAIHB or Indian Health Service

- ▶ 7 deaths of AI/AN people in the Northwest have been reported to the NWTEC Surveillance system or Indian Health Service
 - ▶ 7 Washington Tribal Members
 - ▶ An early SNF death included an AI/AN individual from a member tribe, however it is not reported in our data
 - ▶ Total from surveillance and anecdotal data is 8 at this time

(corrected data since last presented on May 5, 2020)

NPAIHB COVID-19 Surveillance Survey

- ▶ Data collection for Portland Area:
 - ▶ Clinic staffing, staff exposure/illness
 - ▶ PPE and test kit status
 - ▶ Testing results & patient status
- ▶ ALL tribes and I/T/U clinics should report:
 - ▶ Daily reporting required for Abbott ID NOW analyzer sites
 - ▶ Other tribes: daily if possible, weekly at minimum

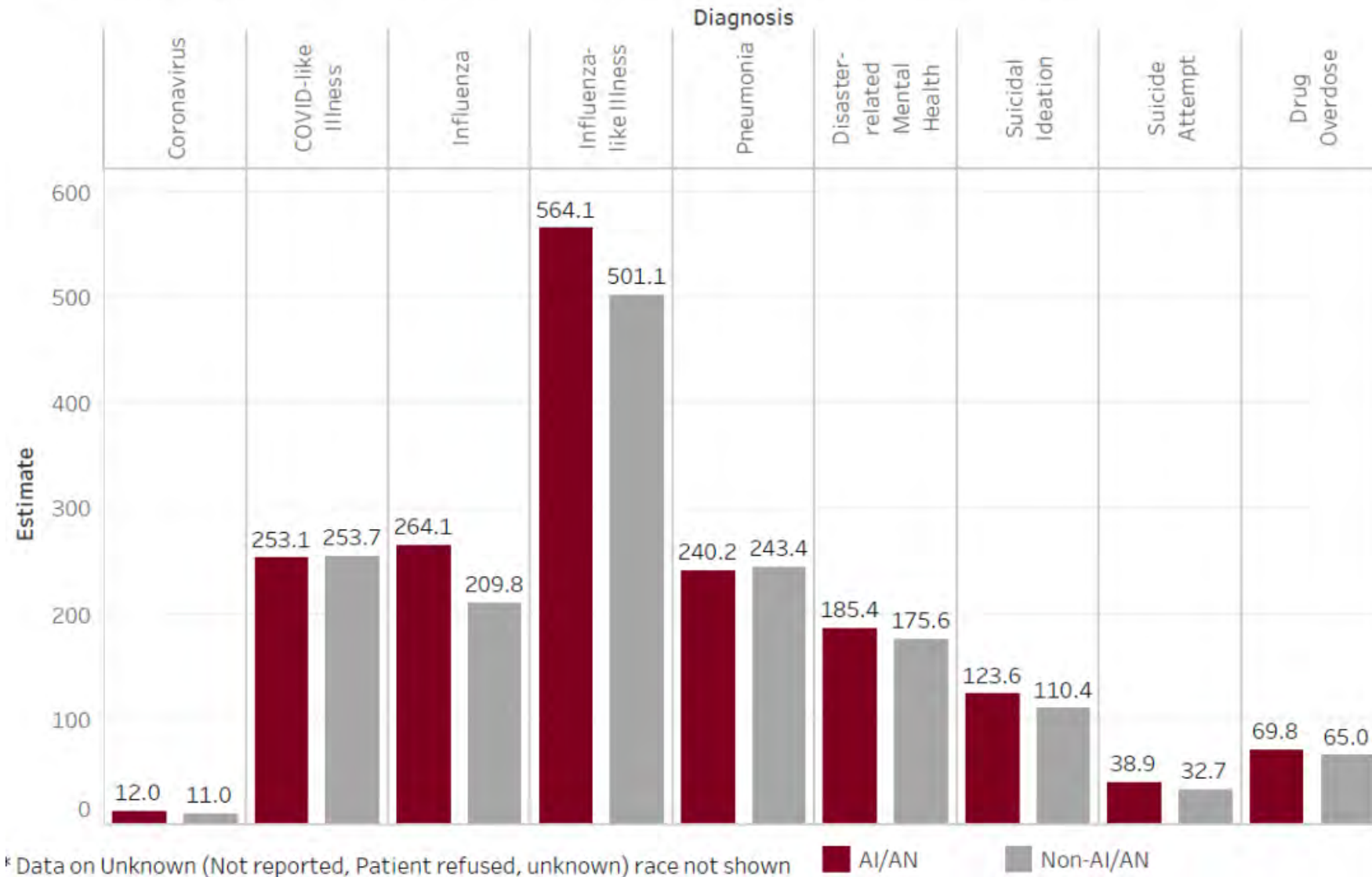

COVID-19 Emergency Department Rates by Indicators and Race *, Oregon, 12/22/2019-5/9/2020.

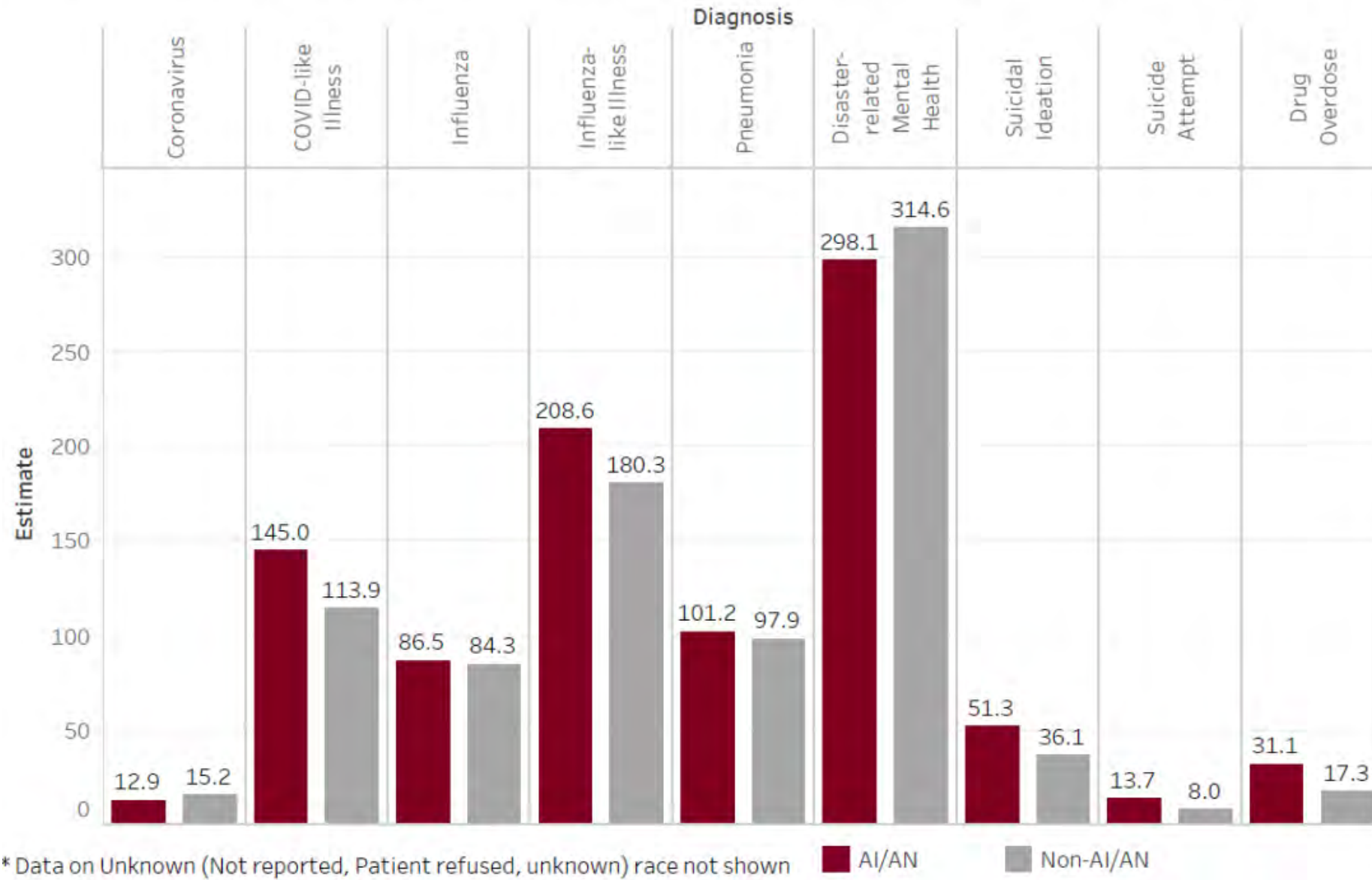

COVID-19 Average Effective Reproductive Number in Washington

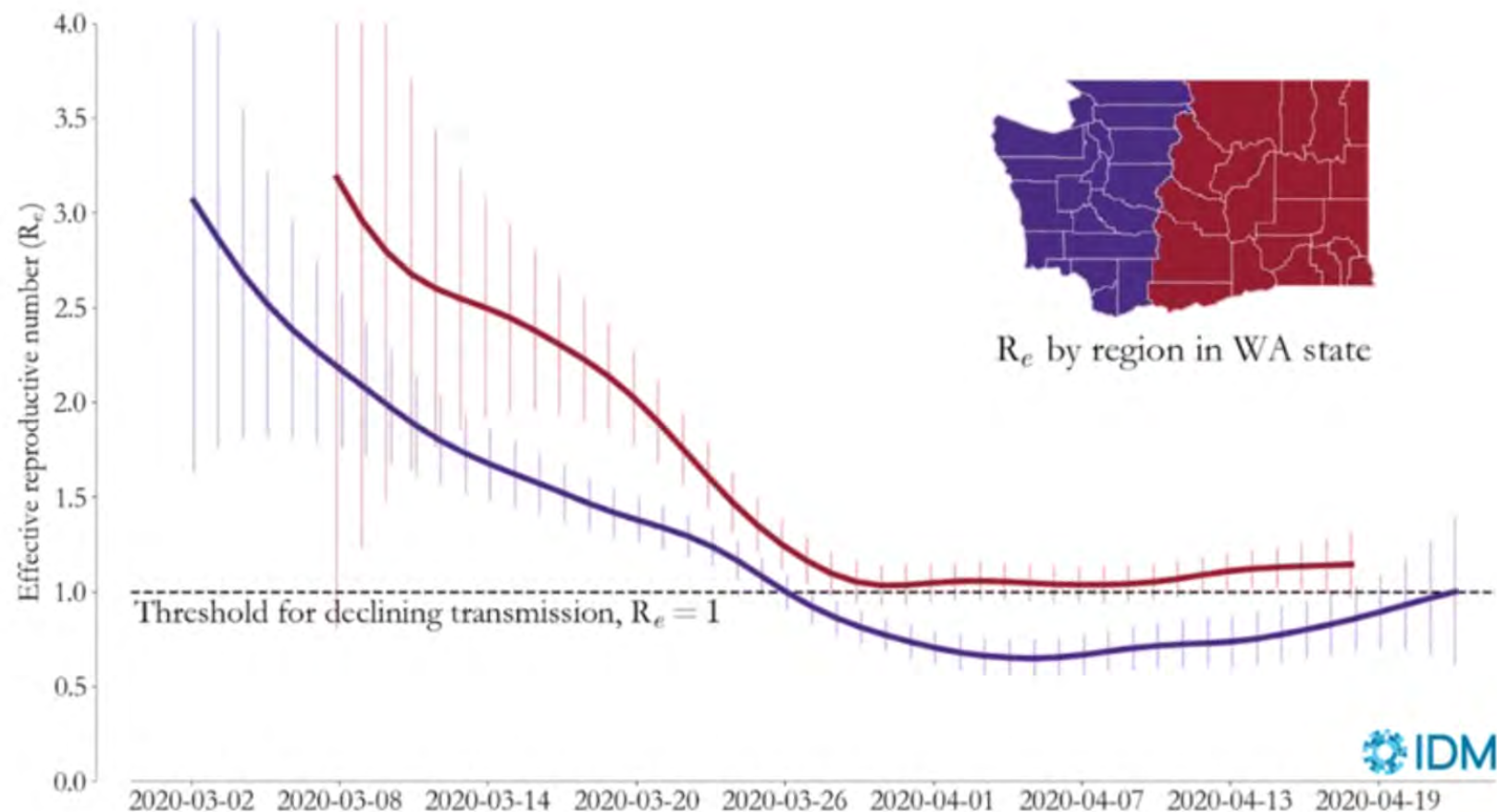

There are persistent differences between Western and Eastern Washington

Dynamics across all of Western WA mirror those in King County (which is only 54% of cases in the region).

The average effective reproductive number across the entire Eastern WA region has been persistently higher than that of Western WA, and may also be trending upward.



Note that modeling at this level can't distinguish the impact of super-spreading events from widespread community transmission, which may be relevant for policy.

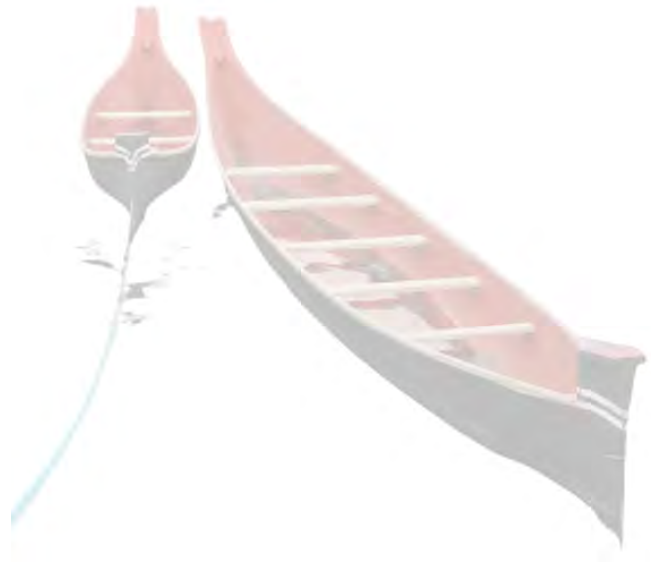
