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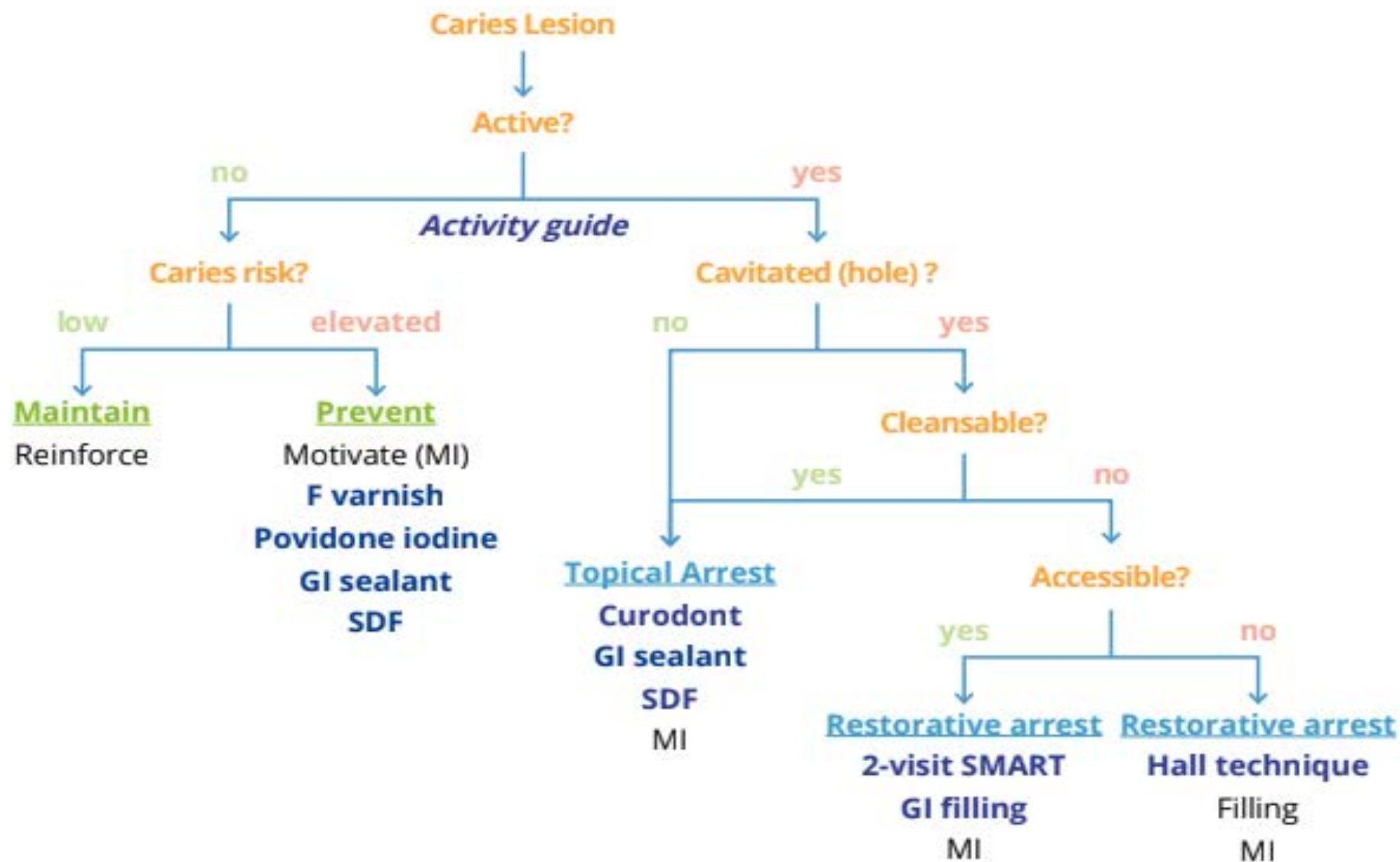

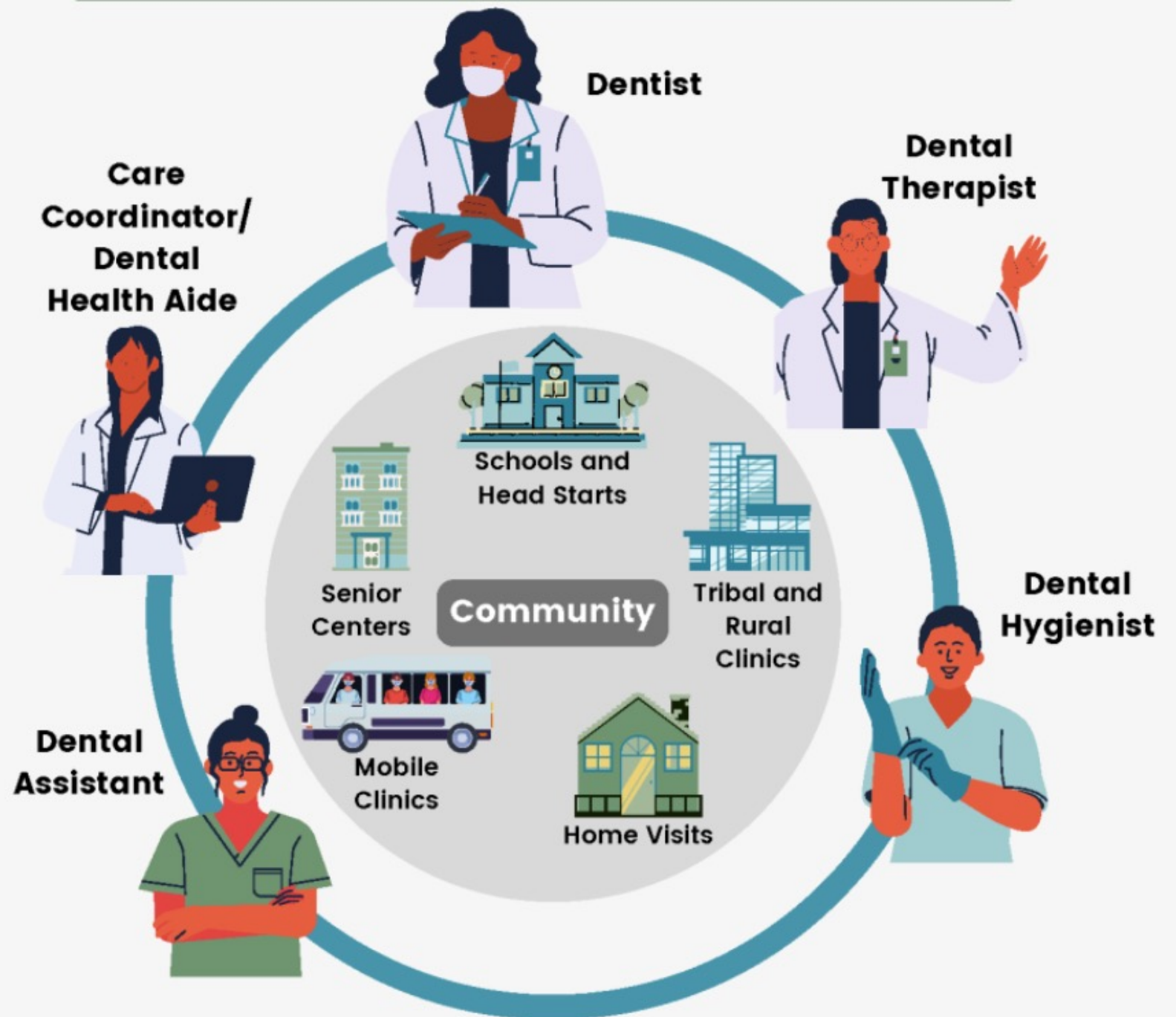


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Non-Invasive Dentistry flow chart



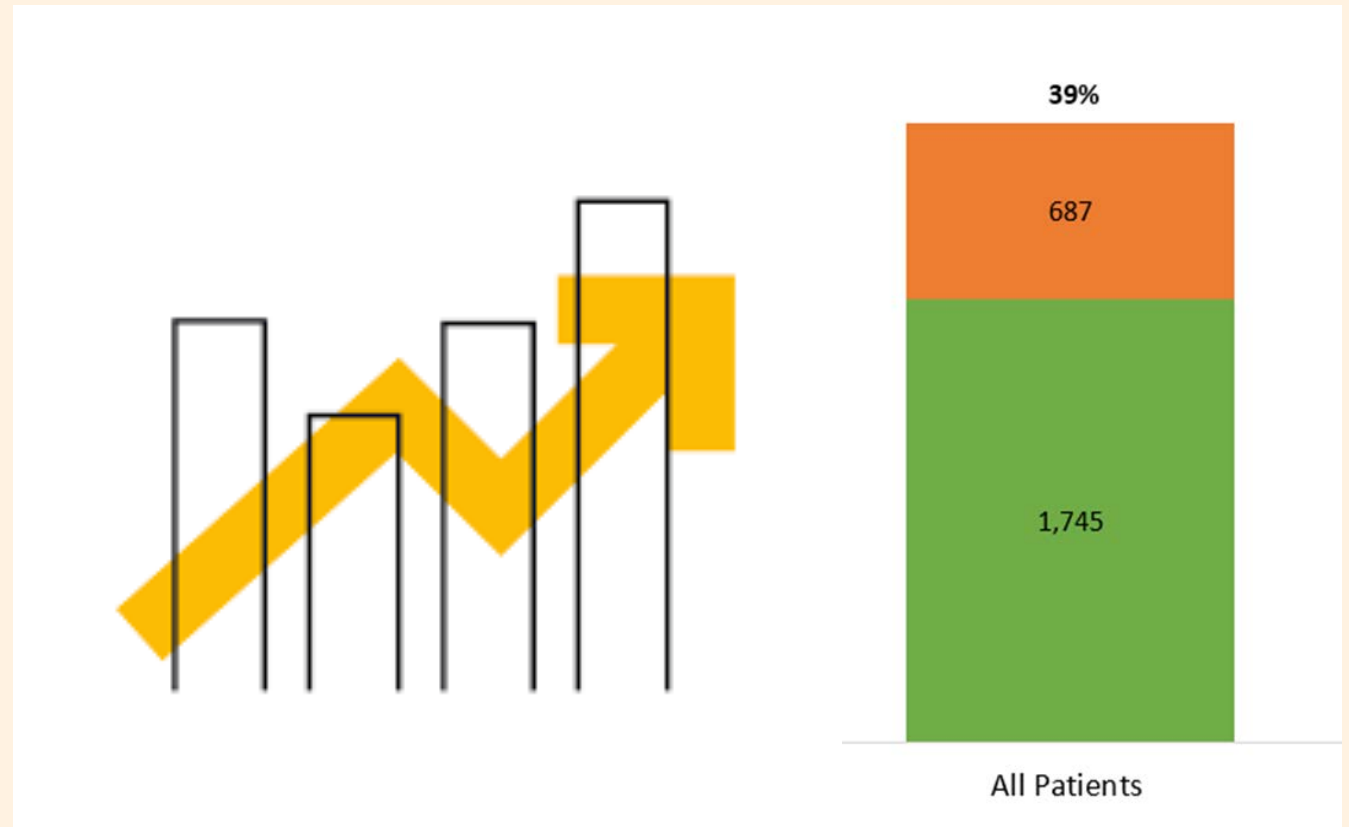

NTDSC and Arcora: Dental Data Dashboard

❑ Supports clinics to utilize aggregate data to monitor:

- ❑ Access to care
 - ❑ **User population**
 - ❑ **Kept appointments**
- ❑ Disease/health
 - ❑ **Treatment completed**
- ❑ Preventive care
 - ❑ **Fluoride**
 - ❑ **Sealants**
- ❑ Additional metrics possible
 - ❑ **(future phases)**



Why Data and a Dashboard?

- > Allows you to manage basic dental measures and provide you the opportunity to further evaluate your dental program. In general, it provides a tool for goal setting and planning.
- > Dental metrics (aggregate data) allow each program to monitor their own progress and evaluate for improvement.
- > The dashboard will not only allow you to follow your own clinic's data trends but will also allow you to compare your program with the aggregated data from our area.
- > Clinics will have the needed information to plan Quality Assurance and/or Quality Improvement projects that are meaningful. This will assist you in meeting certain accreditation (AAHC) requirements.
