What is an active threat?

- An Active Threat is a situation where one or multiple people's lives are at stake.
- Whether it be active shooter, workplace violence, terrorism or a bomb threat.

We are here today to talk about what you can do during an active shooter situation.

- These types of incidents are increasing.
- It can happen anytime and anywhere.
- There might be multiple people.
- It is a Danger to the public.
- Raise awareness on the subject.

We are now going to inform you of the options you can take during this type of situation.

- It is best advised to evacuate as quickly and safely as possible.
- Others may choose to stay where they are, you can try to convince them to evacuate with you.
- Prevent others from entering the area.
- Call 9-1-1 when it is safe.
- Remember, time is short.
- Always keep an alternate exit in mind.

!!RUN!!

!!!HIDE!!!

- If there is no chance of evacuation, you may have to hide.
- Choose an area that can be made defensible.
- Hide behind very large objects.
- Break visual, keep out of line of sight
- if you are in hiding remember to silence your cell phone and remain calm.

USING DEFENSIVE TACTICS

- Defensive tactics is used to protect yourself in a situation like this.
- It is recommended to barricade yourself in a room using small to large objects depending on the door.
- Other tactics include hiding behind large objects, using distractions to lure the attacker away.



!!FIGHT!!

- **!!THIS IS A LAST RESORT!!**
- You are in real danger, the time has come to defend yourself.
- Use aggression to fend off the attacker.

Using Offensive tactics

- Attacking the attacker, using objects or physical attacks.
- Using any type solid objects that can be used for throwing or swinging.
- Yelling and screaming is also used in some situations.
- Use these to incapacitate the attacker by any means.

Here is what to do when law enforcement arrives

Please remain calm and follow instructions.

Keep hands clear, when raising them please spread fingers.

DO NOT interrupt the police officer on scene.

DO NOT make sudden moves or yell and point.

Exit where the police are entering.

- Give information to a dispatcher or police officer if possible when you get a chance.
- Relay the information in detail.

Other things to note

- *Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate.*
- *Assess, Leave, Impede, Violence, Exposure*
- *Avoid, Deny, Defend*
